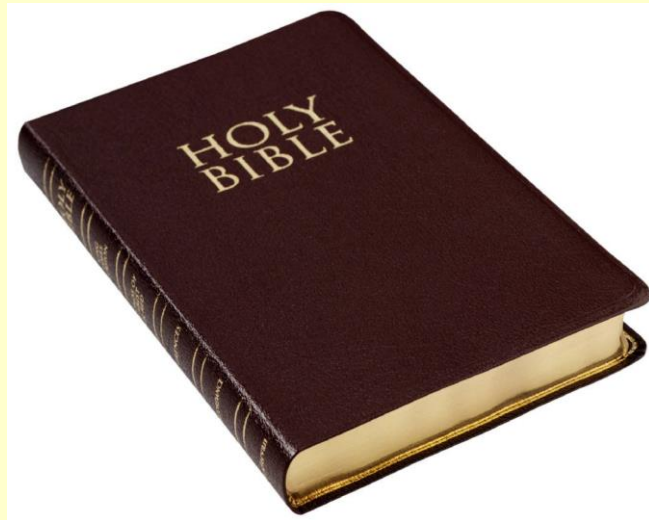

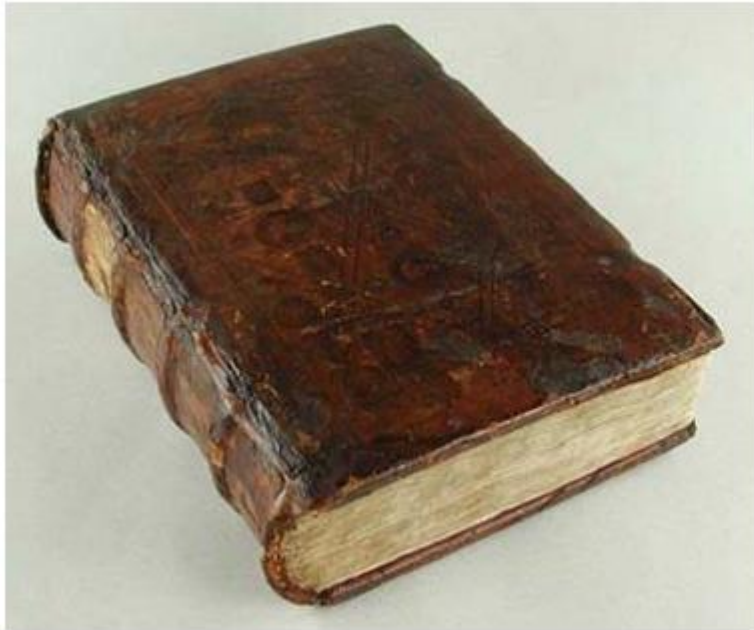

The Aranyakas

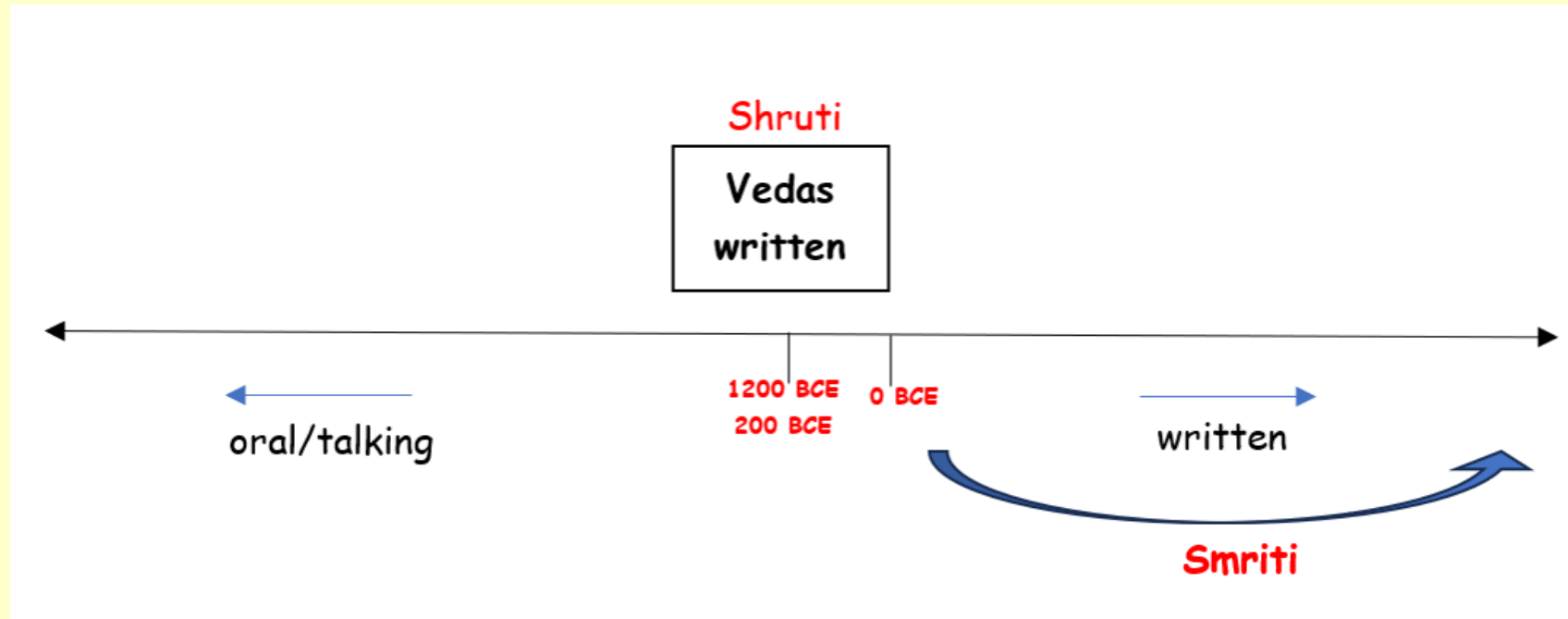
This part explains spiritual ideas like Brahman (ultimate soul) and reincarnation (Karma/Moksha).
