

School Closures Policy

Agreed by Governors September 2024

Mission Statement:

Reasons for closure

Schools may be closed for a number of reasons including:

- > Fire / arson
- Loss of heating
- Loss of power
- > Loss of water supply
- > Gas leaks
- > Flooding
- > Storm damage
- > Heavy snow
- > Criminal damage
- > Other health & safety issues
- National Pandemic/Lockdown

Decision to close the school

It is ultimately the head teacher's responsibility to close the school. Unless in the instance of a National Lockdown in which case the school will be guided by the Government.

- 1. Head teacher (or their deputy) to be informed of the major incident as soon as possible.
- 2. Head teacher to establish who is safe and who is not.
- 3. Head teacher / relevant site staff to try to prevent closure if practically possible.
- 4. Head teacher to decide to close the school based on the relevant information

<u>Heating</u>

It's a requirement that your building should have a minimum temperature of 16 degrees Celsius. There is no maximum requirement but should be based on the particular circumstances.

Heating engineers will be available during winter months (Monday to Friday) from 7:00 am. It is a requirement of your caretaker to check the heating system for any faults. Please report as soon as possible any problems with the heating to the out of hour's service. Telephone 0191 455 6111

It is envisaged that this service will prevent a closure in some cases

Low temperatures or changes in times should continue to be reported during normal school hours to the energy conservation team on (0191) 424 7466

Reporting a closure

- 1. During normal school hours (8:00 am to 16.30 Monday to Friday):
 - Asset Management at South Shields Town Hall. They will send an all education staff e-mail & contact the press office who will be informed of the reason for closure, number of pupils affected and likelihood of when the school will reopen.

- 2. Out of normal school hours (16.30 to 8.00 am Monday to Friday, all day Saturday & Sunday):
 - Neighbourhood Services will provide heating engineers during the winter period from 7:00 am, Monday to Friday. The caretaker having checked the boiler in the morning should report the problem as soon as possible.
